Tarantás, a large four wheeled vehicle with a leather top - used chiefly for traveling on bad roads

Great Morskáya, one of the main streets in Petrograd

Kópek, about a penny - one hundredth part of a rouble

Desyatína, about 2 3/4 acres

Sázhen = 7 feet, firewood is usually sold by the square sázhen. The logs are laid to a height of one sázhen, the depth being 21" which is the length of each log

Verst = 2/3 of a mile

Arshin = 28 inches

Chétvert = about 5 3/4 bushels
